SUMMARY OF THE WORK OF THE LEGISLATION COMMITTEE 2000-2001

INTRODUCTION:

The role of the Legislation Committee is to scrutinise certain legislation (essentially Assembly general subordinate legislation) to ensure that it is within the enabling powers and is properly drafted. Its statutory basis is set out in sections 58 and 59 of the Government of Wales Act 1998 and its functions are detailed in Standing Order 11.

This is the second Annual Report on the work of the Legislation Committee, covering the period September 2000 - September 2001. During that time, the Committee considered a total of 202 pieces of subordinate legislation producing reports on each one.

This annual report provides an overview of the Committee's deliberations on each piece of legislation scrutinised and considers the impact of the Committee's reports. The results are presented in summary tabular form for ease of reference.

The report also covers the wider aspects of the Committee's work including its general interest in the presentation and quality of National Assembly legislation.

SECOND YEAR ANALYSIS:

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES: Standing Order 11.5

Standing Order 11.5 sets out grounds on which the Committee are to invite the National Assembly to pay special attention to legislation. The grounds are as follows:

- doubt whether the legislation is within the Assembly's powers
- the legislation appears to make unusual or unexpected use of the powers
- it is excluded from challenge in the courts
- it appears to have unauthorised retrospective effect
- its form or meaning needs further explanation

- its drafting appears to be defective; or
- it fails to fulfil statutory or other legal requirements
- there appear to be inconsistencies between the English and the Welsh texts.

Before reporting to the Assembly, the Committee informs the relevant Assembly Secretary of their intention and invites him or her to give evidence to the Committee under Standing Order 11.4.

Where a defect is capable of correction by Memorandum of Correction, the Committee does not formally report the matter under SO11.5. It submits a "clear" report expressed to be conditional upon the Minister laying an appropriate Memorandum of Corrections. During the reporting period it happened on 36 occasions (17.8%). Of these, there were 31 cases of drafting defects, 4 cases of inconsistencies between the English and Welsh texts (2 of them in the Orders which had drafting defects as well) and 1 case where greater clarity was needed.

Within drafting defects there have been 11 instances of the omission of the coming into force date.

The Committee invited the Assembly to pay special attention to legislation on 4 separate occasions (1.98% of orders) for the following reasons:

- Drafting defects (1 case) SO 11.5 (v)
- Failure to fulfil statutory or other legal requirements (2 cases) SO 11.5 (v)
- Form or meaning needs further explanation (1 case) SO 11.5 (iv)

General Observations

Besides reporting formally under Standing Order 11.5, the Committee's reports to the Assembly have included observations on minor typographical and similar defects which do not warrant formal reporting, suggestions as to instances where drafting could be simplified or made clearer and occasionally matters of detail relevant to the understanding of the legislation.

The Committee is conscious of the need to ensure that Assembly legislation is drafted in a modern style using clear, plain language. Short sentences are encouraged. The Committee made suggestions on the need for greater clarity or where drafting could have been simplified to assist the reader on 59 occasions (29.20%). Typographical errors were found in (71) cases (35.14%). (14) cases (6.93%) contained grammatical errors.

The suggestion of the Committee on the elimination of gender specific language has been generally adopted. Only 5 orders were found to contain instances of gender specific language (2.47%).

The National Assembly is required to produce bilingual legislation except where this is inappropriate or not reasonably practicable. 87.12% Orders were drafted bilingually, totalling (176) Orders. Out of these, only 18 orders (10.22%) received contained inconsistencies between the English and Welsh texts.

However, the Committee has expressed concern that foot and mouth disease statutory instruments coming through under executive procedure have generally been made in English only. The Committee appreciates that special circumstances, such as foot and mouth disease outbreak, require urgent actions to be taken quickly and consistently throughout Great Britain and therefore it is vital to issue identical legislation simultaneously in all areas of the country. Still, the Committee considers that for the Assembly to fulfil its commitment and obligations to bilingualism it should establish procedures to enable it to issue legislation in English and Welsh even in urgent situations.

Out of total 202 orders considered by the Committee during the period from September 2000 to September 2001, 184 are available as final printed versions. Of these, 71 final versions (38.58%) fully took into account Committee's suggestions; 46 final versions (25%) incorporated some of the suggestions; and 28 final versions (15.21%) did not incorporate the suggestions. The Committee did not need to make any comments in respect of 39 orders (21.19%). At present, final printed versions have not been issued as yet for 18 orders (8.91%).

In some instances the legal advisers to the Committee will have been able to comment on an early draft of the legislation. Where this has enabled points to be raised which have then been corrected in the final draft, this is generally recorded in the Committee's report.

Procedures By Which Legislation Is Made

The National Assembly processes legislation in four different ways: by Standard Procedure, Executive Procedure, Accelerated Procedure or Extended Procedure.

Standard Procedure

Under the Standard Procedure, the responsible Minister publishes a draft Order to all members and invites comments on whether it should be considered by a subject committee. Normally the Minister also carries out a regulatory appraisal of the likely costs and benefits of the draft Order. The Minister then submits the draft Order to the Business Committee and recommends whether it should be referred to a subject committee. Following Business Committee consideration, the Deputy Presiding Officer decides whether the draft Order should be referred to a subject committee (extended procedure) and, after any report by the subject committee, the Minister tables the draft

Order in Plenary and refers it to the Legislation Committee. The Legislation Committee then reports on whether the Assembly should pay special attention to the draft Order. After being approved by the Assembly, the Order may be made (SO 22).

Ninety four pieces of Assembly legislation (46.53%) which came before the Committee had been made under the Standard Procedure. Fourteen (14.89%) of these were subsequently reported on under Standing Order 11.5 and drawn to the special attention of the Assembly.

Extended Procedure

The extended procedure is when a draft Order is sent to a subject committee by the Deputy Presiding Officer as outlined within the description of the Standard Procedure above (SO 22.6 – 22.8).

Two pieces of Assembly legislation (0.99%) which came before the Committee had been made under the Extended Procedure. These were not reported under Standing Order 11.5.

Accelerated Procedure

The Accelerated Procedure is when, on motion of the Minister, the Assembly votes to approve a draft Order without any debate (SO 22.25).

Forty two pieces of Assembly legislation (20.79%) which came before the Committee had been made under the Accelerated Procedure. Eight (19.04%) of these were subsequently reported on under Standing Order 11.5 and drawn to the special attention of the Assembly.

Executive Procedure

Under the Executive Procedure, the Assembly Cabinet may determine that it is not reasonably practical to comply with a range of the standard procedure stages, including seeking approval from the Assembly. Where an Order has been made without consideration by the Assembly a Member may within 40 working days of the Order being made table a motion that the Order be revoked.

Sixty three pieces of Assembly legislation (31.18%) which came before the Committee had been made under the Executive Procedure. Six (9.52%) of these were subsequently reported on under Standing Order 11.5 and drawn to the special attention of the Assembly.

OPERATIONAL MATTERS

Despite tight deadlines due to weekly meetings, the operational side of the Committee has run smoothly. As soon as a draft order has been laid before the Assembly it appears on the next available meeting agenda, together with an associated report by the legal adviser. The Secretariat aim to provide Members with all papers two working days before the meeting. Following each meeting the Secretariat ensures that the Committee's Reports are laid before the Assembly as soon as possible, often on the same day. The reports and minutes are placed on the intranet and internet within two working days and the aim is also to send letters from the Chair within this time scale.

SUBMISSION TO THE ASSEMBLY REVIEW OF PROCEDURE

On 12 July 2000 the First Minister announced a review to discuss how the Assembly had operated in its first year, and to establish the lessons which might be learned from that. The Legislation Committee made a submission to the Assembly Review of Procedure Group suggesting the following changes:

- Information on forthcoming subordinate legislation be made available to all Assembly Members at regular intervals, with a copy to the Legislation Committee;
- Subject Committee Chairs be issued with separate and regular information on forthcoming subordinate legislation specific to their area of responsibility;
- More time be devoted to debating subordinate legislation proposals in subject committees and in plenary;
- Grounds for report under 11.5(v) be amended to include failure to fulfil standing order requirements and Orders to be accompanied by a checklist setting out steps they had been through before reaching the committee;
- The Minister be required to provide an explanation of why the executive procedure was necessary;
- The Legislation Committee should be able to specify whether it would prefer a written response to its queries or require the Minister to attend in person to give required explanations;
- The Legislation Committee be required to produce an Annual Report;
- There should be made available for all Assembly Members a flow chart illustrating all the stages that subordinate legislation made under the standard procedure may be required to go through and information on where each piece of legislation is up to be available on the Intranet and Internet.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Visit to the Scottish Parliament

A delegation from the Legislation Committee comprising the Chair, Jocelyn Davies, Dai Lloyd, the two legal advisers and the Clerk visited the Scottish Parliament on Tuesday 5th September 2000. The purpose of the visit was to see the Subordinate Legislation

Committee of the Scottish Parliament in operation and further exchange views on practices and procedures. The delegation was welcomed by the Deputy Presiding Officer who outlined some of the experiences of the Scottish Parliament to date and his personal view on public perceptions. Then the delegation was joined by the Convenor and members of the Subordinate Legislation Committee for a short briefing session prior to their private and public meetings.

The representatives of the Legislation Committee were present at both private and public sessions. They noted that in preparation for the meetings members were issued with a paper from the Legal adviser giving advice on each piece of subordinate legislation under consideration along with any delegated powers provisions within a Bill (which constituted a particular difference between the Scottish and the Welsh committees).

John Turnbull, Dylan Hughes and the Clerk also saw the European Committee in action and members sat in on the Local Government Committee.

Although it was concluded that the practices and procedures of the Scottish and Welsh Committees were quite different, the visit proved to be useful and informative. The legal advisers felt that the Committee's reports would look more professional if they carried the Assembly logo, as was done in Scotland.

Visit of the Chair of the Committee to the International Conference on Regulation Reform, Management and Scrutiny of Legislation

The Regulation Review Committee of the NSW Parliament visited the Assembly in July of last year and extended an invitation to the Legislation Committee and the Presiding Officer to send a representative to the International Conference on Regulation Reform, Management and Scrutiny of Legislation.

At its meeting on 30th January 2001 the Legislation Committee agreed that the Chair of the Committee should accept an invitation from the Chair of the New South Wales Parliament Regulatory Review Committee to attend the International Conference on Regulation Reform, Management and Scrutiny of Legislation for the purposes of reviewing the way the Committee and Assembly scrutinises its subordinate legislation.

Accordingly, the Chair of the Legislation Committee Mick Bates took part in the International Conference on Regulation Reform, Management and Scrutiny of Legislation, which took place in Sydney (Australia) in July this year. As the Legal Adviser to the Committee, John Turnbull, was unable to attend, Mark Partridge from the Office of the Counsel General was deputed to accompany Mr. Bates. On Friday, 13th of July, Mr. Bates made a presentation entitled "Regulatory Reform - A Welsh Perspective".

The Conference was attended by delegations from Westminster, Scotland and Northern Ireland. The UK Parliament delegation consisted of Lord Mayhew of Twysden, Mr. Peter Pike MP and Clerk to the Delegated Powers and Deregulation Committee of the House of

Lords Ms Philippa Tudor. The Scottish Parliament was represented by Mr. David Mundell MSP (Conservative, South of Scotland), Mrs Margaret Macdonald, Senior Assistant Legal Adviser, Scottish Parliament Legal Adviser's Office and Alasdair Rankin, Clerk to Committee. Members of the Northern Ireland Assembly Danny Kennedy and Donovan McClelland accompanied by Peter Hughes were also present.

The keynote speakers were the Governor of New South Wales Her Excellency Professor Marie Bashir AC, Chief Justice of the High Court of Australia The Hon. Chief Justice Murray Gleeson AC, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, Australia The Hon. J Spigelman.

Among others the presentations covered the following topics:

- Future Regulation and Scrutiny of Legislation in Italy;
- When Enough is Enough: The Limits of Regulation-Making Powers;
- Challenges for Australia and the Commonwealth in Regulatory Reform;
- Regulatory Horror Stories - Australian and International;
- The Role of Parliament in Ensuring the Quality of Law and Regulation;
- United Kingdom Regulatory Reform Bill: Impact on Deregulation Process;
- The Devil in the Detail - A New Zealand Perspective of the Scrutiny of Delegated Legislation;
- National Competition Regulation Policy;
- Valuing the Community's knowledge - Information Technology, the Web and the Scrutiny Process;
- Rules, Principles and Legal Certainty in Regulation;
- Regulatory Reform - A Welsh Perspective (presentation by Mr. Mick Bates AM);
- Citizen Participation in Legislative Rule Making: The Impact of Federalism and Internationalisation;
- The Spirit of Scrutiny: Wisdom is the Way.

A range of topics was discussed in Workshops, including:

- Future of Regulation and Scrutiny of Legislation in Italy: An In-Depth Perspective;
- Why Reinvent the Wheel when the Australian Service Model Works?
- Regulatory Impact Assessment - When, How and Why;
- The Role of Parliament in Ensuring the Quality of Law and Regulation - An In-Depth Perspective.

The Chair of the Committee will make a detailed report on the Conference at the meeting of the Legislation Committee in October.

Presentation on Bilingual Lawmaking and Justice by the Counsel General

Following his trip to Canada last year Counsel General offered to share with the Legislation Committee the information which he obtained on his visit concerning the "co-drafting" technique used by legislative drafting lawyers in the Canadian Federal Government. The Legislation Committee invited Mr. Winston Roddick to make his presentation at the meeting on 19th June 2001 and a further question and answer session was held on 17th July 2001.

The Counsel General's presentation was entitled "Bilingual Lawmaking and Justice". It covered various aspects of the preparation of bilingual legislation by the Canadian Federal Government and the New Brunswick State Government. The Canadian legislation system is based upon that used in Britain. Mr Roddick explained that at present the National Assembly drafted legislation in English and it was then translated into Welsh. However, in Canada the English and French versions are drafted simultaneously by two lawyers working together, each in his/her first language. Exchange visits have been undertaken between staff of the Canadian government and those of the National Assembly.

Regarding the breach of SO 22.26, although the Minister acknowledged that there had been a case non compliance, he suggested that this case did not relate to the Committee's power of scrutiny. The basis for that proposition was indicated as being section 58(7) of the Government of Wales Act. The Committee, however, was in no doubt that it should be able to draw to the attention of the Assembly the fact that an instrument was not submitted to it within the time-scale envisaged in SO 22.26. The Committee thus considered it appropriate to report to the Assembly that it should pay special attention to this failure to comply with SO 22.26.

- Given the temporary Nature of the Commission Regulation, the Committee asked the Minister to confirm that the inserted Regulation 3A would be revoked to avoid any doubt as to its effect. The Minister indicated that Regulation 3A is expressly drafted on the basis that it was only an offence to contravene Article 2.1 so far as it remained in force.

- to confirm that action to enforce the Regulations by prosecution or otherwise could be brought under the Regulations against a keeper who whilst having a holding or cattle in Wales, is resident elsewhere in the United Kingdom;
- to indicate whether the power of entry which was conferred on inspectors by Regulation 10(1) was confined to land and premises within Wales;
- to indicate whether Regulation 10(2)(b) - (e) was intended to confer, and if so to what extent, powers of access to records which were kept outside Wales in relation to cattle and holdings within Wales.

The Minister:

- confirmed that proceedings for an offence committed in Wales could be brought against a person resident anywhere in the United Kingdom;
- confirmed that the power of entry in Regulation 10(1) was confined to land and premises in Wales;
- suggested that Regulation 10(2)(b) – (e) did not confer powers of access to records that were kept outside Wales, having indicated, however, that records should be kept on the registered holding and that inspections would be carried out jointly with the Ministry of Agriculture in the case of cross border holdings.

The legal advisers to the Committee have sought further guidance on the position arising in relation to a holding wholly within Wales but for which records were maintained at premises outside Wales. The Committee was content with the explanations given, and did not raise any further matters under Standing Order 11.5.

In respect of general observations the attention was drawn to three minor problems with the Welsh text.

The Committee identified one point reportable under S.O. 11.5 that was appropriate for correction when the Order was printed and published (coming into force provision was inconsistent in the head of the Order and in Article 1(2)). Under general observations the Committee noted that there was an inconsistency between the coming into force provision at the head of the Order and in Article 1(2).

Additionally, there was a typographical mistake in Article 2(2) and the Schedule.

LC269 The Local Authorities Executive Arrangements (Functions and Responsibilities) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2291 (W.179))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5. The legal advisers had an opportunity to look at an earlier draft of these regulations and identified a number of points which had been taken into account in the final draft.

The Committee made some general observations regarding the Regulation 2(2)(a)(i) (it was accepted that the provision was properly included on the basis that there may be powers to impose conditions, limitations or restrictions, which are to be found in statutory provisions other than those listed in column (2) of Schedule 1), some typographical errors, several inconsistencies between the English and Welsh texts and a grammatical error in Welsh text.

LC270 The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Discharge of Functions) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2287 (W.175))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The Committee did not invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the Regulations on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5, but it made two general observations: it was suggested that the listing of the sections should read "... 105(2) and 106(1), (2) of ..." and that the footnote would need to be completed prior to publication.

LC271 The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Decisions Documents and Meetings) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2290 (W.178))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5. The legal advisers had an opportunity to look at an earlier draft of these regulations and identified a number of points which had been taken into account in the final draft. The Committee made some

general observations regarding the definite article in the title, the inclusion of footnotes and typographical errors in the Welsh text.

LC272 The Local Authorities (Proposals for Executive Arrangements) (Wales) Order 2001 (SI 2001 No.2277 (W.167))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The Committee did not invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the Order on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5, but it made some general observations: section 31(2) could not apply in Wales. Thus section 31 would only apply where regulations were made under subsection (1)(b). The relevant regulations were to be issued with a coming into force date of 28 July 2001.

LC273 Local Authorities (Proposals for Alternative Arrangements) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2293 (W.181))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The Committee did not invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the Regulations on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5, but it made a number of general observations regarding the absence of the reference to the provision contained in Regulation 3(3) and incorrectness of some other references.

LC274 The Local Authorities (Referendums) (Petitions and Directions) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2292 (W.180))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The legal advisers had an opportunity to look at an earlier draft of these regulations and identified a number of points of query which had been dealt with, in some instances by corrections to the draft, and in other instances by explanation. Therefore, the Committee did not invite the Assembly to pay special attention to the Regulations on any grounds specified in Standing Order 11.5, but it made one general observation regarding the Regulation 7(5), where the final four lines should not be indented.

LC275 The Local Authorities (Alternative Arrangements) (Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001 No.2284 (W.173))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 5th June 2001

The legal advisers had an opportunity to look at an earlier draft of these regulations and identified a number of points which had been taken into account in the final draft. However, some small points remained. These were typographical and grammatical

mistakes both in the English and Welsh texts and some small inconsistencies between the English and Welsh texts.

Having considered the Legal Adviser's report, Members agreed that there were matters to raise under Standing Order 11.5. It was agreed that as these were minor drafting errors they should be amended under SO22.13 by a Memorandum of Corrections.

The Committee also made two general observations, one regarding the inconsistencies in the maximum number of committees and another regarding the identification of subpoints in paragraph 11.

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5. The legal advisers to the Committee had the opportunity to consider these Regulations when several points were identified that they believed were suitable for correction either by means of Memorandum of Corrections or at the time of printing.

LC299 The Environment Act 1995 (Contaminated Land Commencement and Saving Provision) (Wales) Order 2001 (SI 2001 No.2351 (W.191) (C.79))

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 3rd July 2001

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5. Under general observations the Committee noted that Explanatory Note needed to contain more information in respect of commencement orders, had discrepancies between the Welsh and English texts in Article 1(1) (which were appropriate for correction in the published Order) and had an unnecessary reference to Article 1(3).

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5.

Considered by the Legislation Committee on: 17th July 2001

The Committee identified several points reportable under S.O. 11.5. which were to be corrected by a Memorandum of Corrections: there were inconsistencies between the English and Welsh texts (Regulations 3(a)(ii), 3(a)(iii); in both texts there was a misprint (“14” should be “12” in Regulations 3(a)(ii)); the title is incorrectly translated in the Welsh text (Regulation 3(c)); quotation should be in English, not in Welsh (Regulation 4(1)); there was a typographical mistake in the Welsh text of Regulation 10(a); Regulation 12 contained some misnumbering and there were some grammatical errors in Regulation 17(a). Under general observations the Committee noted that there was a typographical mistake in the Welsh text title on page 1; a small grammatical error in the Welsh text in Regulations 1 and 3(a)(i); reference to the Feeding Stuffs (Wales) Regulations 2001 needed clarification and for greater clarity Footnote (f) needed to include the W number.

The Committee did not identify any points reportable under S.O. 11.5.
